

Is it true?

It was a few days since Jesus had risen from the dead, and rumours were going around amongst those who knew Him, that His tomb had been found empty. Some were saying that it must have been grave robbers – but if that was the case then why leave the most valuable item (the grave clothes) in the grave? And besides, the stone that covered the tomb was massive and there's no way a couple of robbers could move that on their own.

But those closest to Him were claiming that they had seen Him...in the flesh...face to face! How can that possibly be?! He was definitely dead. He'd died in the most brutal and public way that the Romans could have thought of. How could He possibly be alive?

The minds of those who had followed Him must have been racing, thinking back on all the things they had seen Him do, and all the things He had taught them about God. He'd even said that He was going away. He also said this unusual thing about destroying and rebuilding the temple in three days — could it have been that He was talking about Himself?

Two of those disciples were walking along a road, talking about all these things, when a man they didn't recognise joined them (Jesus had opted to hide his identity). He could see they were grieving and asked why. When He found out they were mourning 'the death of the Messiah' He began to talk to them about what the scriptures said about the promised one. He did it in a way that was so captivating to them. Stories that they were familiar with were coming to life. He pointed out that the promised one had to suffer, that it was all part of the plan.

After some persuasion, Jesus stayed at their house for a meal. During that meal there was a moment: this person who was in front of them lifted some bread to give thanks, and something about the way He did it made it impossible for them to not recognise Him – it was Him! It was Jesus! But before they could say anything, He was gone!

They ran as fast as they could back to Jerusalem (about 7 miles away). They had to share the news. The rumours were true! Jesus was alive and they had seen Him!

Jesus began to appear to more and more people in the days that followed, leaving no doubt in their minds (well, Thomas needed a little persuading) that Jesus was in fact the Son of God, the promised one, the saviour of the world, their Lord!

Either this is just a made-up story in the Bible, or it's true.

Those same disciples went on to give their lives in the claim that it was true – why would anyone do that for a made-up story?

If it's just a story, it changes nothing.

If it's true, it changes everything!
