God speaks to us

“God spoke to me today in flowers, and I, who was waiting on words, almost missed the conversation.” Ingrid Goff-Maidoff

This made me smile when I read it. I'm fascinated by the myriad ways God has of speaking to us, and how often we must miss them because our minds are on focussed elsewhere.

I was sitting outside at the weekend, reading and enjoying the warmth of the evening sun. At one point, I lifted my eyes from my book to ponder something, gazing absently towards the somewhat scrubby green in front of me. Then suddenly I felt my eyes refocus so that I could actually see what I was looking at - not just a general colour of green, but distinct blades of grass, gleaming in the sunlight. It was a classic moment of moving from non-awareness into seeing with clarity.

Don't you think that the busyness of life is a bit like that? Our minds are occupied with lots of things and our hearts are a bit glazed over, until something helps us refocus, and then that often helps us see and experience our lives differently.

The book I was reading was called *Nunc* - a tale set in Jerusalem (with wonderful pen and ink illustrations), imagining the story of Simeon and how he came to say his famous *Nunc Dimittis* (Lord now let your servant depart in peace). In it there is a character called Lysander, a depressed, as yet unpublished, elegist. He complains about no one reading his poetry and when Simeon points out that at least God sees it, he replies, “God skim-reads and always says it needs more work.” I often come across people who in the recesses of their hearts have that kind of impression about God with regard to their lives.

When I refocussed on the blade of grass and really saw it, God spoke to me. Not in a flower, but in a blade of grass, and I, who was engrossed in the words of my book, nearly missed it. “I do not skim-read your life. Just as you have intently focussed on this one single blade of grass, I am deeply interested in you, and I do not pronounce that you need more work. I rejoice in your beauty and your singularity which gleams in the light of my Son.”

May God speak to you in flowers this summer - it's a good season for that!



Saturday Community Café is providing an important role in reducing food waste locally.

We want to say a huge **THANK YOU** to everyone who has been involved in collecting food, sorting food, helping run the café, chatting to those who come on Saturdays, and generally spreading the message about what we are doing!

Since January, we have also been working with schools and the GP surgery to offer a targeted service to those in most need of food. We have been able to help 24 people so far (adults and children) and would like to say a huge **THANK YOU** to everyone who has donated food or money, or who has helped with this aspect of the Pantry.

The Pantry is a key ministry for our church, and we are seeing God at work in many ways!

We would like to increase our team of helpers so if you would like to **JOIN IN** and can spare an hour on a Friday evening to help with food collections, time on a Saturday morning to help in the café and chat to those attending, or an hour on Wednesday mornings to help with our targeted service, please talk to Barbara, Phil or the church office, and find out how you can become part of this amazing team!

The Community Pantry has been running for six years, and in early June we passed a very important milestone - we have now carried out 500 collections of food from Tesco via the FareShare scheme!

FareShare has calculated that this adds up to 45,316kg of food which would have been put into landfill – that's the equivalent of 114,602 meals, which is staggering to think about! For those who know about CO₂ emissions, it is 134,233kg of CO₂ savings too, and it all goes to show that as well as sharing the food with local families, our
